



MUNICIPAL GENERAL CANDIDATE SURVEY QUESTIONS AND RESPONSES

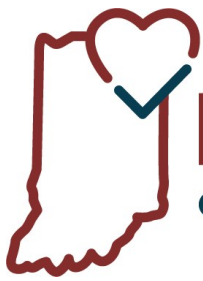
The Right to Life of Northeast Indiana is pleased to present the results of its 2023 Municipal General Candidate Survey. Responses are as follows: Y=Yes, N=No, U=Undecided. Those who did not respond are not listed. An * indicates comments written on the survey by the candidate. Unanswered questions are represented by “/”.

Questions

1. Do you support Indiana’s informed consent law that requires that women be informed, in writing, of the risks of abortion, alternatives to abortion, and fetal development (including information about fetal pain) at least 18 hours prior to an abortion?
2. Do you oppose abortions being performed on pain-capable unborn children?
3. Do you oppose partial birth abortion, the procedure that kills a living child during delivery?
4. Do you believe that abortion providers should be required to dispose of aborted children in a humane manner, instead of treating remains as mere “medical waste?”
5. Do you believe that pharmacy workers should have the right to refuse to dispense abortifacients?
6. Do you oppose pharmacists being able to prescribe abortifacients?
7. Do you oppose physician assisted suicide and euthanasia?
8. Do you oppose all efforts to clone human embryos?
9. Do you oppose fetal stem cell research that requires the destruction of human embryos?
10. Are you opposed to using taxpayer funding to pay for elective abortions or to subsidize abortion providers or referral agencies, such as Planned Parenthood?
11. Do you believe that human physical life begins when a human ovum is fertilized by a human sperm?
12. Do you support your political party’s national platform on abortion?
13. Will you vote only for party and caucus leadership that is committed to protecting innocent life from conception to natural death?
14. Do you oppose any law that would require medical insurance carriers to provide abortion coverage in their standard plans?
15. Do you believe that abortion providers should be required to provide to the State, in writing, proof that they have local hospital admitting privileges or have entered into a written agreement with another physician with local hospital admitting privileges?
16. Do you believe that all abortion facilities should be required to comply with all building regulations regarding health, safety, and access?
17. Do you support laws that promote adoption?
18. Do you oppose legislation that would eliminate current state laws that regulate abortion?
19. Under what circumstances do you believe abortion should be legal? (Treatment for a mother's life threatening illness that unintentionally results in the death of the baby is not considered an abortion.) Mark all that apply.
 - A. Abortion should never be legal.
 - B. Rape and/or incest.
 - C. If the child is determined to have a mental or physical disability or for sex selection.
 - D. Abortion should be legal in all cases.
20. Will you commit to support legislation and existing laws that reflect your positions indicated in questions 1-19, above?
