Allen Co Right to Life and Indiana Right to Life to Hold Press Conference in Fort Wayne

FORT WAYNE, IND. Allen County Right to Life and Indiana Right to Life held a joint press conference calling for a full investigation into Ulrich (George) Klopfer, who died September 3rd. This follows the discovery of over 2, 246 fetal remains at his Will County, Illinois residence shortly after his death. The press conference participants were: Cathie Humbarger, Executive Director of Allen County Right to Life; Mike Fichter, CEO and President of Indiana Right to Life; Serena Dyksen, Live Action Ambassador; Dr. Geoff Cly, MD; Indiana Senator Liz Brown, District 15; Indiana Senator Dennis Kruse, District 14; Indiana Representative Christy Stutzman, District 49; and Mark Archer, President and CEO of New Hollywood Studios.

"Last week we learned that abortionist Ulrich (George) Klopfer passed away. This week we are shocked and saddened to hear that the remains of aborted babies were found at the residence of Abortionist Klopfer in Illinois. He was was responsible for an estimated 30,000 abortions in Indiana. This is the sad conclusion to the life of a tormented man." -Cathie Humbarger, Executive Director of Allen County Right to Life

"We are horrified by the reports of over 2,000 fetal remains being found on the property of Dr. Ulrich Klopfer, a man who operated abortion facilities in Gary, South Bend and Fort Wayne. These sickening reports underscore why the abortion industry must be held to the highest scrutiny. We are calling on Indiana authorities to join in the investigation to determine if these fetal remains have any connection to abortion operations, or personnel, in Indiana." -Mike Fichter, President and CEO of Indiana Right to Life
